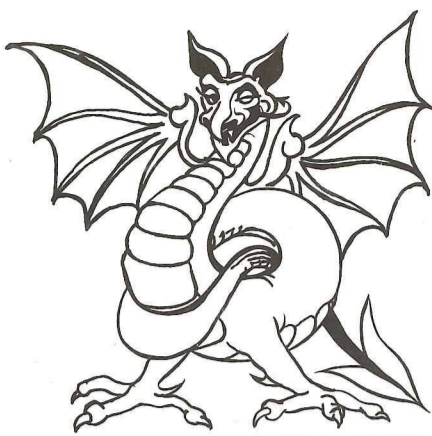

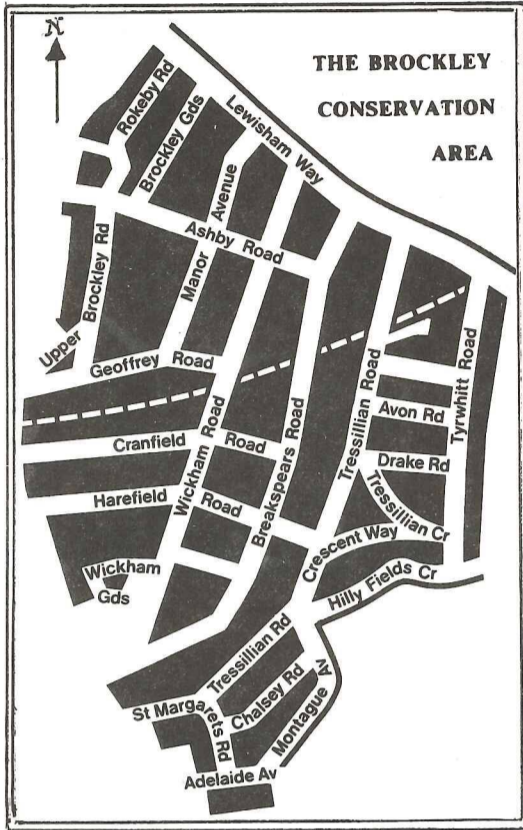

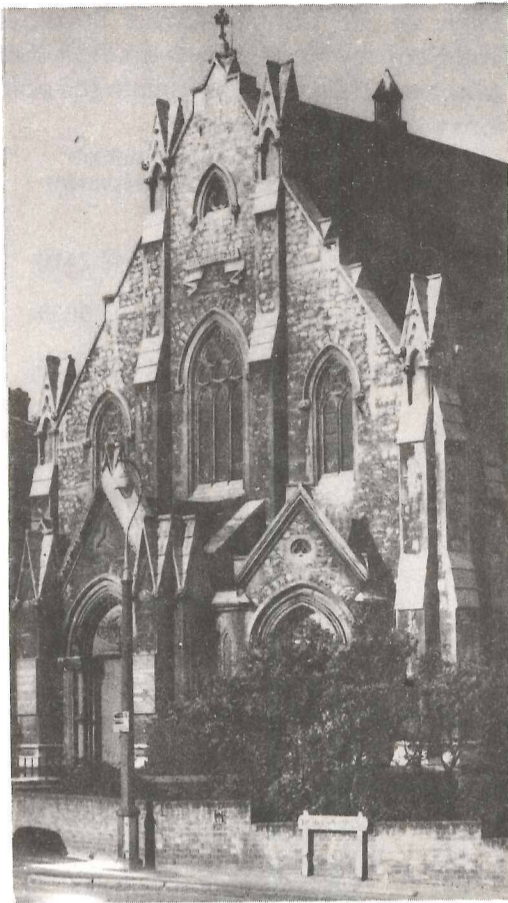

The Brockley area bounded by Tressillian Road and Manor Avenue has more house-breakings than anywhere else in S East London, most occurring during the day.

Many of these unwelcome callers can be kept away by simple security devices. Your front door should be fitted with a British Standard mortice lock: this should be a 5-lever or more to be effective. The rear door should have a similar lock or 2 security bolts, and all accessible windows should be screwed up or have window lock fitted.

The housebreakers could be anyone including boys or girls from 8 or 9 years upwards. Many crimes can be prevented BY YOU by merely noticing anything suspicious and then calling the police by DIALLING 999

Many housebreakers are caught by the alertness of helpful neighbors and it is this spirit of helping each other that is most pleasing to see.

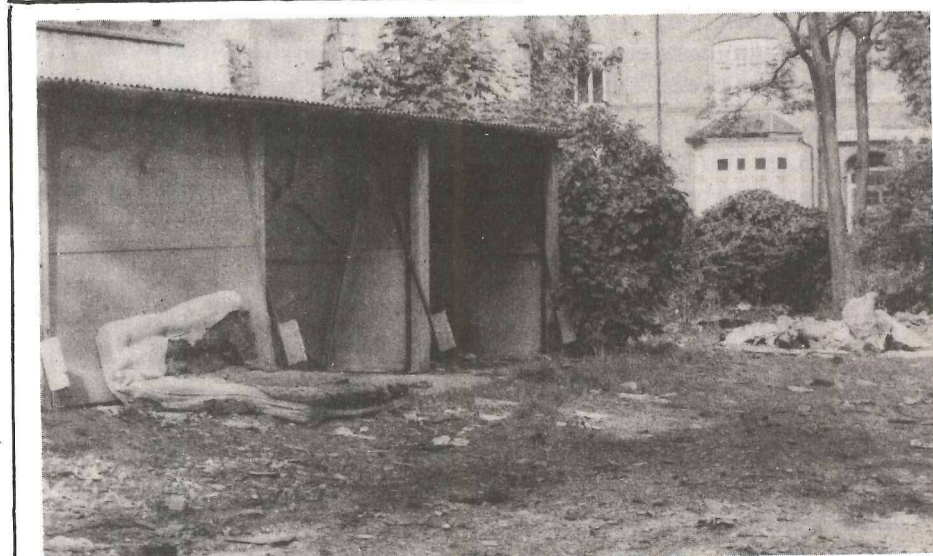

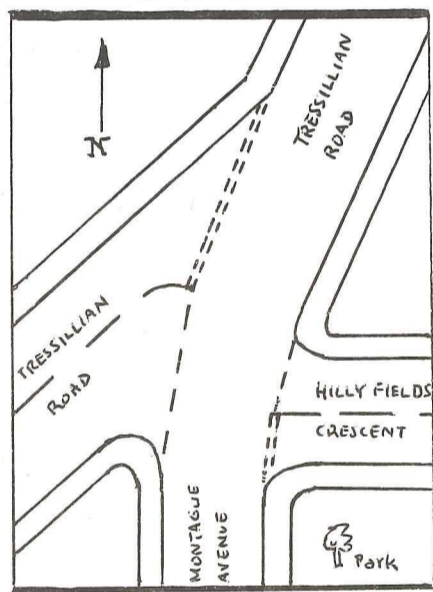


## TRAFFIC

Brockley Society asked the Council to consider a mirror opposite the end of Tyrwhitt Road at Hilly Fields Crescent: but as mirrors are not vandal-proof, need cleaning, and cause dazzle, the request was refused.



At the junction of Hilly Fields Crescent and Tressillian Road, the Council propose to paint white lines across Tressillian Road as shown in the plan above. This will give priority to the traffic in Tressillian Road/Montague Avenue.
