BROCKLEY BAPTIST CHURCH

CONSULTATION is taking place between the Church Architects and Lewisham Borough Council to consider the suggestion that the Church be retained and the other buildings be demolished and that part of the site re-developed.

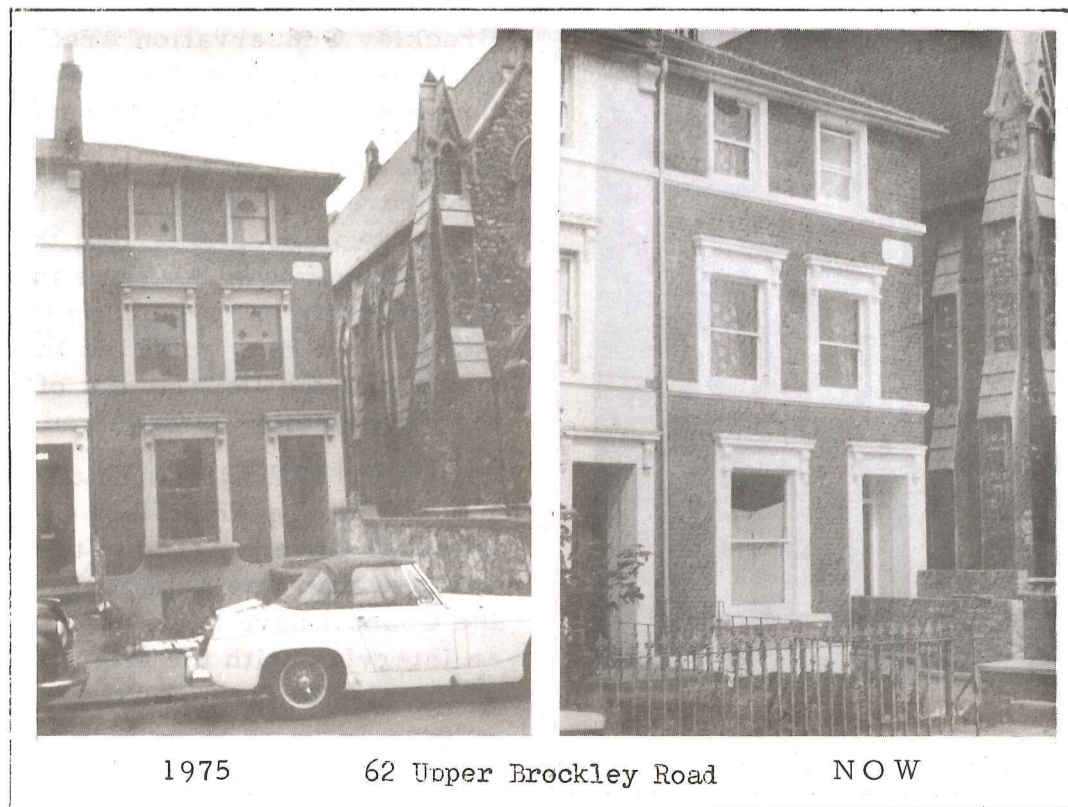
Most of what I have heard so far has been critical, but then people who have no complaints often remain silent. Please let me know what you think -FOR or AGAINST.

By the late Autumn it could become PERMANENT --- either as it stands or with amendments. There will be a Public Meeting in September where you can air your views before it is too late. Lewisham Council appears to think that all is well- do you?

Comments so far include:--

- that Geoffrey Rd is more of a bottle-neck than before.
 - That businesses in Upper Brkly Rd are losing trade and it is difficult for lorries to deliver.
 - that it is difficult for you as a resident to drive across the area- to get to Deptford Library for example.
 - that you have to drive nearly a mile to put your car in the garage at the bottom of your own garden.
 - and numerous comments about the effect of the bus lanes.

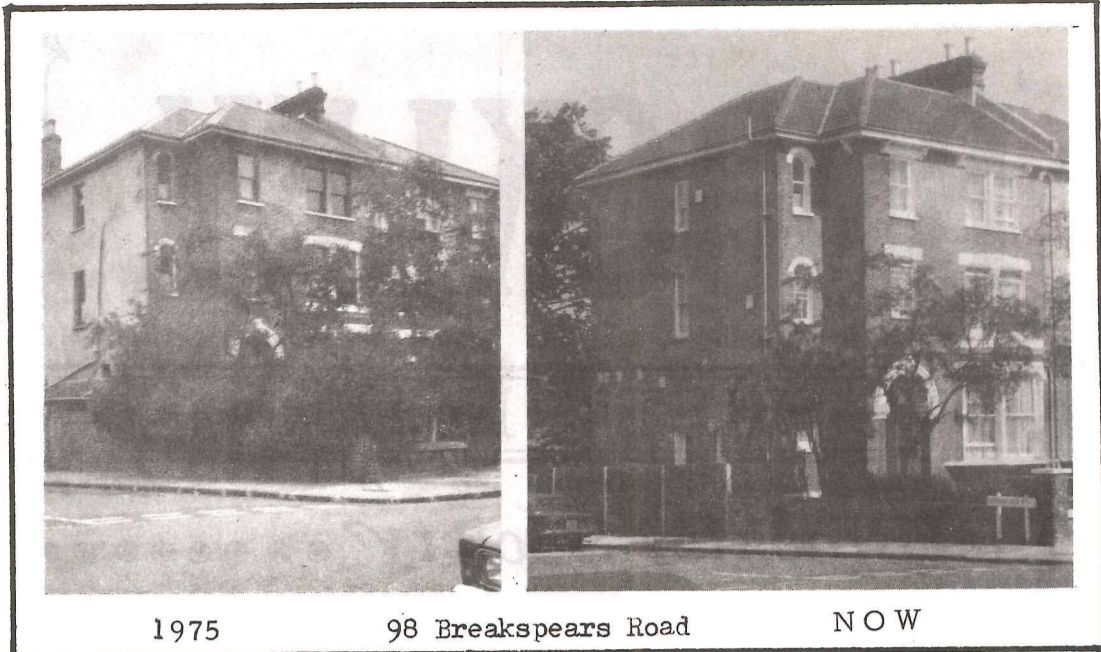

EMPTY HOUSES

WE ARE OFTEN ASKED WHY Council-owned houses in the area are vacant and why repair work seems so long delayed.

Councillor Nicholas Taylor has very kindly compiled a list of the present situation with all Council-owned houses in the Brockley Conservation Area & we hope to publish this fully in the next BrocSoc MiniNewsheet.

All the houses on the list last year have been renovated with one or two exceptions, but the main delays have been due to the difficulty in re-housing the existing tenants, and also that consent of the Department of the Environment is required.

The other difficulty is that the Council has received less cash from the Government for this purpose than was expected, but the Council have been granted an interview with the Minister of Housing to discuss this.

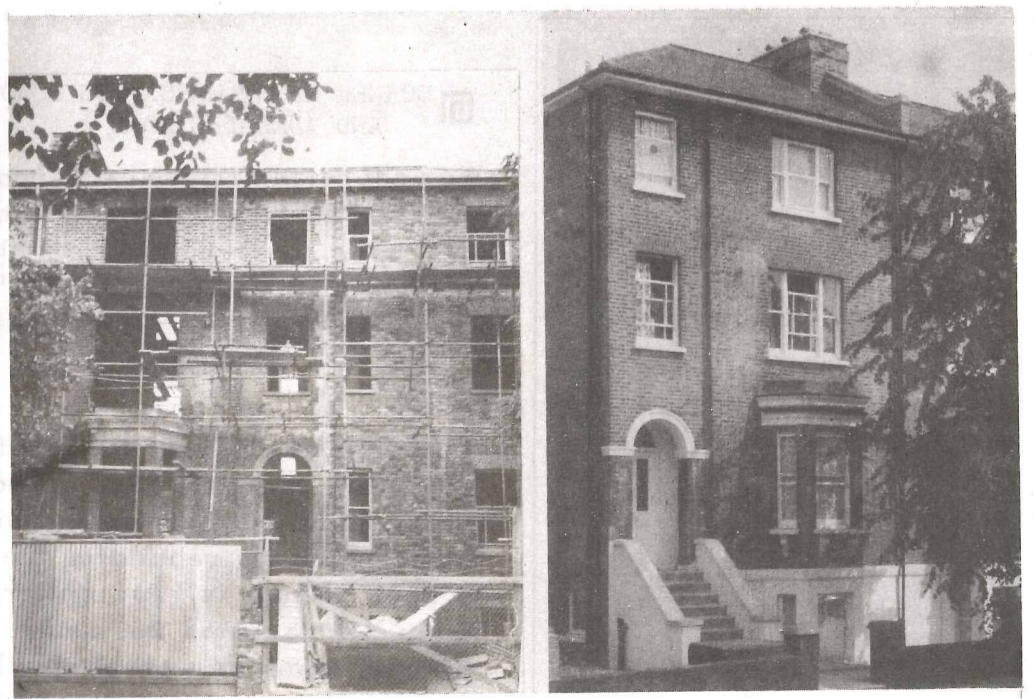
STOP PRESS
