Luxmore Gardens success



Luxmore Gardens Park User Group has chalked up a success. This little park (tucked behind Lewisham Art House) had a forlorn air in the past. But in mid-May the opening took place of the improved children's play area with the support of all the children from nearby Little Gems nursery and Cllrs. Darren Johnson and Obajimi Adefiranye (Centre). The children planted sunflower seeds and enjoyed juice and cakes.

The sandy surface in the play area has been replaced with a safety surface, making it much more usable.

The Park Users' Group has been going only a year but they have achieved much in that time. The park has been cleaned up, an extra dog bin installed and all the benches and tables have been refurbished. Last year they had an afternoon with Myatt Garden School pupils putting up six bird boxes. 'I have seen a blue tit using one,' Users' Group member Kelsey said.

The park is now locked at night which, while not popular with dog owners, means the character of the park is changing. 'Local families are using it more,' Kelsey continued, 'and if the playground catches on this will help too.' There is one more corner of the park, where the ranger's house used to be, which is still just concrete. The Users' Group hopes the council will be able to clear this. Civic Trust Award for Millennium Stone Circle

This year the Civic Trust has awarded seven Special Awards, 50 Awards, 79 Commendations and 49 Mentions in the UK's city and Metropolitan areas from 524 submissions. Next year's awards will be in rural areas.

The awards are to highlight the very best urban and environmental design all over the UK. The range of projects entered was vast: from new buildings and restorations, to landscape schemes and a light railway system.

There were three key issues that were important to all schemes: sustainable design, context, and access for people with disabilities. The Civic Trust is committed to promoting these ideas in order to achieve the highest standards of planning and development for communities in the UK.

Sustainability means not just the quirky end of design incorporating hay bales and turf, but mainstream buildings built to a high standard of sustainability. The Sustainability Award went to Jubilee Campus, University of Nottingham.

The Civic Trust wants architects to take context more seriously. Buildings need to enhance their local environment and be of long term benefit to the community. Bold and imaginative projects need to sensitively consider the environment in which they are set, as the Merrill Lynch building in the City of London has done.

The third concern is access. Some projects, like the Royal Court Theatre, provide outstanding examples of access provision, but some are let down by detail, like a handrail that stops before a flight of stairs.

Brockley Society is proud to record that the Millennium Stone Circle on Hilly Fields has achieved one of the 49 Mentions and is listed as 'A community project to build a stone circle to celebrate the Millennium'. BrocSoc played the major role in the project which contains all the three elements listed above.

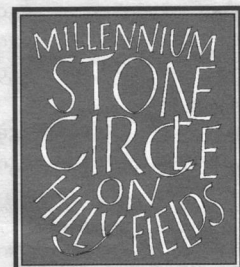

The importance of grass roots organisations like the Lewisham Art House to the balanced development and continuance of visual arts in Britain, has been highlighted by Dr Stephen Deuchar, Director at Tate Britain. His personal letter of support, while not representing the Tate organisation officially, has provided a real boost to morale at the Art House.

We were grateful for the speed and strength of support from Brockley Society. Proposals are very welcome for extending information and profile-raising. We have produced a full colour 25-page ten-year report to gather support. Here are some of the plans:

- ◆ **LAH** is developing a group of advisors, akin to Patrons. Advisors will be asked to contribute regular voluntary work (two hours per year) to further assist with profile raising and networking on behalf of the Art House.
- ◆ **LAH** is examining a number of action plans to secure the future of the organisation and the Old Deptford Library building.
- ◆ **LAH** hopes to develop a partnership that enables its voluntary workforce to concentrate on developing the organisation and the partners to focus on the building, securing more funding for a long term programme of renovation.
- ◆ **LAH** is committed to the old Deptford Library building remaining in the public domain and not becoming a private venture.

Lewisham Council is undertaking a number of major repairs after the Open Studios, including the replacement of a pillar to the vaulted roof, repairs to cracks in ceilings, and repairs to external walls.

Clr Alyson McGarrigle recently visited the Art House. A meeting with Dave Sullivan is being rescheduled and LAH will be inviting the new mayor of Lewisham to tea.

Mason's flourishes in Ladywell!

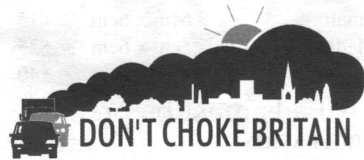

A visit to Stone House

Stone House is the imposing house opposite Lewisham College on Lewisham Way.

Comical House (as it was once known) is rarely seen except during charity fund raising musical events a few times a year.

On 11 May, the owner opened his doors to a small group of Lewisham Environment Trust members and the Broc Soc Chair, organised as part of Local History Week. The fine Palladian style building is decorated superbly with original ceilings and a new mural in one room by Greenwich artist Peter Kent, showing the riverside at Greenwich itself. The renovated lantern crowns the well-type central space, and has interesting views over Mumford's Mill in Deptford.

The group could only just fit in the space, and the interesting servants' quarters on the way up



were revelatory.

George Gibson built the House between 1771 and 1773 on the stable sands at the top of the hill, although he seemed to think enormous

buttresses were required. There is rumoured to be an associated ice house further downhill, when the house had large grounds. The stables and coachhouse in Ashmead Mews have recently been converted to housing.

The impressive portico will be landscaped, part of the ongoing

expensive works that the owner is doing without grant aid. As a result of his passionate renovation, English Heritage have raised its status from Grade II to II*.
